<p>REGARDING AN APPLICATION OF: DrSwanMusic, LLC., represented by Luke Patrick Henry, for a Public Assembly License for a one day music festival and camping, Summers End - The Draper Rendezvous on August 22, 2020</p>	<p>STAFF REPORT By: Allison Marks Date: February 18, 2020</p>
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**REQUESTED ACTION:** The applicant, DrSwanMusic, LLC., represented by Luke Patrick Henry, proposes to hold a music event on August 22, 2020 referred to as Summer’s End - The Draper Rendezvous. The event exceeds the maximum number of (750) persons allowed to assemble without a license. The application states that the maximum attendance will be 1,000. The property is located at 11 Croy Creek Road, also known as Lions Park.

**APPLICABLE REGULATIONS:**

Title 2-Business and License Regulations: Chapter 2  
Title 9-Zoning Regulations: Chapters 7 & 17

**Summary**

This is the second year for the Summer’s End - The Draper Rendezvous to be held 12pm-11pm on August 22, 2020. It is proposed as a “Festival to provide music, food, and arts and a summer community event to the Wood River Valley. Music will cover local, regional, and national bands.” New this year is a camping option August 21 & 22 out Croy Creek Rd. on the soon to be City of Hailey Snow Storage Lot. A camping option is also proposed for artists only in Hop Porter Park and Lions Park. (Event Description, Exhibit A-2 & Camping Plan Exhibit A-14)

**The following items are not compliant with Blaine County Code and would require waivers from the Board for approval:**

1. §2-2-3(F): states that no event shall be held within ¼ mile of the mean high water mark of any public water body.
2. §2-2-5(A)1d: requires 1 physician and 1 nurse and/or EMT. **2 EMT’s are proposed.**

No public comment has been received as of the date of this report.

**II. Criteria for Review and Evaluation under Blaine County Code, Title 2, Chapter 2**

**Chapter 2: PUBLIC ASSEMBLIES**

*A. License Required: No person shall permit, maintain, promote, conduct, advertise, act as an entrepreneur, undertake, organize, manage, sell or give tickets of free entrance to an actual*

*or reasonably anticipated assembly of seven hundred fifty (750) or more persons, whether on public or private property, unless a license to hold the assembly has first been issued by the Board of Commissioners. Licenses issued under this Chapter are nontransferable and shall be in effect for a maximum of one 24-hour period. A license shall be required for assemblies of less than seven hundred fifty (750) persons where assemblies are held at multiple locations by affiliated persons and the cumulative total of persons attending the multiple locations is seven hundred fifty (750) or more.*

**>Staff Comment:** The proposed event is anticipated to have 1,000 attendees; therefore the applicant is required to obtain a license. In 2019, the applicant counted 700 attendees at the busiest time of the festival 4pm-11pm.

*B. Number Of Persons: Before issuance of a license, the applicant shall determine the maximum number of persons which will be assembled or admitted to the location of the assembly; provided, that the maximum number of persons shall not exceed three thousand five hundred (3,500); and provided that, where the assembly is to continue overnight, the maximum number shall not be more than is allowed to sleep within the boundaries of the location of the assembly by Federal, State, and/or local laws. If the proposed assembly is held at multiple locations by affiliated persons, the cumulative total of persons attending the multiple locations shall not exceed three thousand five hundred (3,500) persons.*

**>Staff Comment:** The application states that the number of total attendees will be between 700-1,000. In addition, approximately 50 paid and volunteer staff will be in attendance. The event will begin at 12pm and end at 11pm. Set up and break down will happen the day before and after. Camping within unincorporated Blaine County jurisdiction will be located at the future City of Hailey “Snow Storage” property and will not exceed 150. Camping at Lions Park will not exceed 5 RV’s and 2 tented vendors.

*C. Separate License: A separate license shall be required for each location in which seven hundred fifty (750) or more persons assemble or can reasonably be anticipated to assemble.*

**>Staff Comment:** N/A – there is only a single location proposed.

*D. Fees: The fees for each application and license shall be as set by the Board of Commissioners.*

**>Staff Comment:** The applicant has paid an application fee of \$300. A fee reimbursement/waiver has been requested (Exhibit A-19) to offset green components of the event for water bottle and compostable silverware (\$2,500) and the new City of Hailey requirement of a 6 yd dumpster for compostable materials. In addition, to help the organizer off-set costs associated with the financial burden of creating a new community event.

E. *Ticket Sales: A license shall permit the assembly of only the maximum number of persons stated in the license. The licensee shall not sell tickets to nor permit more than the maximum permissible number of persons to assemble at the licensed location.*

**>Staff Comment:** Conditionally complies if not more than 1,000 tickets are sold.

F. *Location: No license shall be issued to any anticipated assembly where the proposed location is within one-fourth (<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>) mile of the mean high-water mark of any public water body. In no event may such assemblies be located further than two (2) miles, as measured by vehicular travel, from the city limits of Hailey, Ketchum, or Sun Valley, or where hazardous, dangerous, or detrimental to the public health, safety and welfare unless appropriate safety provisions have been satisfied. The site of the proposed assembly must be accessed from a paved State or County road.*

**>Staff Comment:** Does not comply. The proposed location is within ¼ mile of a public water body (the Big Wood River). The proposed location lies within the required maximum distance of 2 miles from the city limits of Hailey, as set forth in this standard. Fencing will be erected around the river and surrounding the park. Security and volunteer crews will be onsite to mitigate participant and river safety hazards. THIS STANDARD WOULD REQUIRE A WAIVER BY THE BOARD.

G. *Exceptions: This Chapter shall not apply to:*

1. *Any regularly established, permanent place of worship, stadium, athletic field, arena, auditorium, coliseum, school or other permanently established place of assembly, provided approval is obtained from the appropriate fire official for any number of persons in excess of the structure's maximum seating capacity.*

2. *Government sponsored fairs held on regularly established fairgrounds or to assemblies required to be licensed by other ordinances and regulations of the County, or to assemblies within any incorporated municipality within the County.*

3. *Family celebrations including, but not limited to, anniversaries, weddings, or birthday parties held at a private, existing residence, ranch, or farm.*

4. *Employee gatherings held by local business establishments at a private, existing residence, ranch, or farm.*

**>Staff Comment:** None of the above exceptions G.1. through G.4 apply.

#### **2-2-4: APPLICATION FOR LICENSE:**

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A. *Filing Period: Application for a license to hold an actual or anticipated assembly shall be made in writing to the Board of Commissioners at least ninety (90) days in advance of the proposed assembly.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. Application submitted January 27, 2020.

*B. Sworn Statement Required: The application shall contain a statement made upon oath or affirmation that the statements contained therein are true and correct to the best knowledge of the applicant and shall be signed and sworn to or affirmed by the person making the application.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. Signed sworn statement is on file.

**2-2-5: CONDITIONS FOR ISSUING LICENSE:**

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**>>>The Board of Commissioners may waive any or all of the requirements set forth in this Chapter upon finding that a proposed assembly, or a portion thereof, poses little or no risk to the public health, safety, and welfare.**

*A. Requirements: Before issuance of a license, the applicant shall provide proof that the following will be in place, at the applicant's expense, before the assembly commences:*

*1. Health Requirements:*

*a. Potable water, meeting all Federal and State requirements for purity, sufficient to provide drinking water for the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least one gallon per person per day and appropriate measures for the disposal of wastewater.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. Applicant indicates that refillable water bottles will be sold at the event and attendees will be encouraged to bring their own bottles. Potable water is available at Lions Park near the baseball diamond. In addition, vendors are to dispose of all wastewater off site. (SCPHD B-2)

*b. Enclosed toilets, meeting all State and local specifications, conveniently located on the grounds, sufficient to provide facilities for the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least one toilet for every one hundred twenty (120) persons; regular and efficient sanitary means of disposing of waste matter deposited therein no less than once every twelve (12) hours, which is in compliance with all State and local laws and regulations; a lavatory with running water under pressure and a continuous supply of sanitary items in each toilet; and sufficient maintenance personnel and equipment to ensure that the toilets are regularly maintained.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. According to this standard, 9 portable toilets are required for 1,000 attendees. The applicant indicates that 12 portable toilets (10 Standard and 2 ADA) will be provided, which is more than our code requires. Please see Exhibit B-2, South Central Health Department (SCPHD) Comment Letter. South Central Health District states that their guiding document recommends 13 toilets for an event of 500-1,000 lasting 10+ hours. This recommendation differs with our County Code standards. SCPHD stated verbally on 5/6/2019 that it is a guiding document only and that the county can recommend whatever they think is suitable. In addition, the applicant proposes 5 wash stations to coincide with the portable toilet station. Clear Creek Disposal will provide service change between 4-5pm.

**Camping site on future City of Hailey snow storage site (unincorporated county) proposes 4 portable toilets, 1 ADA portable toilet and 1 washing station.**

*c. A sanitary method of disposing of solid waste, in compliance with State and local laws and regulations, sufficient to dispose of the solid waste production of the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least two and one-half (2.5) pounds of solid waste per person per day, together with a plan for holding and collecting all such waste at least once each day of the assembly, sufficient trash cans with tight fitting lids, separate and sufficient recycling bins for glass and tin, and personnel to perform these tasks.*

**>Staff Comment: Complies. 2-Six yard dumpsters (1 for biodegradable food waste materials as required by the City of Hailey) and approximately 15-20 trash and recycle bins dispersed throughout baseball diamond.**

*d. Physicians, nurses, and emergency medical technicians licensed to practice in the State for the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least one physician continuously in attendance at the assembly for every one thousand (1,000) persons and at least one nurse and/or emergency medical technician continuously in attendance for every six hundred (600) persons, together with an enclosed, covered structure where treatment may be rendered, containing separately enclosed treatment rooms for each physician, and at least one emergency ambulance available for use at all times.*

**>Staff Comment: Does not comply. According to this standard, one physician and one nurse and/or emergency medical technician continuously in attendance for every six hundred persons with an enclosed structure. The applicant proposes 2 EMT's. (Only 1 secured to date: Josh Fields, EMT). The applicant is waiting to hear if he needs to hire a second EMT or if WRFR will have a volunteer available that day/evening.**

**A 20' unobstructed fire lane and turn around for emergency personnel will be located as depicted in Exhibit A-5. The fire lane extends both to the baseball diamond and pagoda as required last year by WRFR. A first aid tent will be illuminated behind the baseball diamond with a licensed EMT. One (1) EMT will be on call for overnight camping. (Exhibit A-2, A-4, A-5))**

**Suggested Condition: Two (2) EMTS shall be secured 30 days prior to the event. The applicant shall submit the name of the second EMT to Land Use Department.  
THIS STANDARD WOULD REQUIRE A WAIVER BY THE BOARD.**

*e. The plans for health requirements shall be submitted to the South Central Health District for approval at least sixty (60) days prior to the proposed assembly.*

1. **>Staff Comment: Conditionally Complies. Matt Wildhagen of South Central Public Health (SCPHD) stated that any food vendors secured for the event must be licensed establishments or have proper exemption form. (Exhibit B-2)**

**Suggested Condition: Copies of all food vendor permits shall be submitted to South Central District Health at least 2 weeks prior to the event. Copies of permits shall be submitted to Land Use Department.**

*2. Lighting: If the assembly is to continue during hours of darkness, illumination sufficient to light the central area of the assembly, to include the medical and health facilities, at the rate of at least five (5) foot-candles, but not to shine unreasonably beyond the boundaries of the enclosed location of the assembly or between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. Lighting for the assembly shall comply with all applicable County ordinances and adopted codes.*

**>Staff Comment: Conditionally Complies. Lighting will be generated from the stage and in back of the park. Another generated light is proposed for the parking lot. Solar garden lighting is also planned throughout the park and to illuminate first aid, fire/security, and volunteer tents. (Exhibit A-12)**

*3. Parking: A free parking area inside the assembly grounds sufficient to provide parking space for the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least one parking space for every three (3) persons. In the event that the site and/or access to it cannot accommodate the number of persons expected to attend the assembly, the Sheriff of Blaine County can require the applicant to provide parking at other sites as well as transportation between those additional parking sites and the site of the assembly. Sufficient dust abatement measures shall also be in place.*

**>Staff Comment: Conditionally Complies. The applicant proposes to utilize 20-60 parking spots at Lions Park with an EMT/Fire drive-through in case of emergencies. Parking onsite is designated for staff of the event including artists, vendors, and disabled parking. Parking passes will be required to park at Lions Park. (See parking plan, Exhibit A-8, A-10). Parking available at the Park and Ride Lot at River and Bullion in Hailey. In addition, plan indicates the use of the Kings/Albertsons/and the parking lot next to McDonalds. A shuttle will be provided to the event from these lots.**

**In addition, the applicant will provide a pathway for event participants down Croy Street on the north side of the road, from River Street to the festival grounds not blocking driveways and homes. Volunteer Security will watch these pathways for safety. One tent will be at the intersection of River Street and Croy Street with volunteers directing traffic and pedestrians. They will also be checking parking passes and ensuring Croy Canyon citizens can drive to their residences. Another tent will be located at the entrance of Lions Park. The applicant states directional signage will be distributed throughout the City of Hailey for direction and guidance.**

**Please see Blaine County Road and Bridge comment letter (B-3).**

**Suggested Conditions: 1. Encroachment Permit to be secured 30 days prior to event for any encroachment in the County Right of Way. 2. No parking permitted along Croy Creek Road due to increased fire potential in August.**

4. *Telephones: Telephones sufficient to provide service for the maximum number of persons to be assembled, at a rate of at least one telephone for each five hundred (500) persons, placed in accessible locations throughout the assembly area and at all medical and security facilities.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. Several cell phones will be on site during the event including the organizer and at the medical tent.

5. *Camping Facilities: Camping facilities may be provided by the applicant at the site of the assembly and said facilities shall be in compliance with all Federal and State requirements sufficient to provide camping accommodations for the maximum number of persons to be assembled. In the event that temporary camping facilities are not available at the site of the proposed assembly, the applicant may provide temporary camping facilities elsewhere which shall be approved by the Sheriff of Blaine County.*

**>Staff Comment:** The Blaine County Sheriff had no issues with the proposed temporary camping/ festival. He did refer the commission to the other local safety and emergency entities of the City of Hailey. (Exhibit B-1)

**The City of Hailey and The Wood River Land Trust will be the new landowners of the camping location and the access to the camping location in August. Both entities have met with the applicant in regards to the camping component. Staff suggests a condition that the applicant get written permission 90 days prior to the event by whomever the landowner(s) are at that time, May 22, 2020.**

6. *Security: Either regularly employed, duly sworn off-duty peace officers of the State, or other qualified individuals sufficient to provide adequate security for the maximum number of persons to be assembled at the rate of at least one security guard for every two hundred fifty (250) persons as a minimum shall be provided by the applicant. A list of security guards and their qualifications shall be presented to the Sheriff of Blaine County for approval at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed assembly. In the event the Sheriff of Blaine County requires extra personnel to provide security for the proposed assembly, the applicant shall deposit with the Board of Commissioners a cash bond in the amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to pay for additional security personnel if necessary. A higher bond may be required if the Board of Commissioners determines that a higher bond is necessary to protect public health, welfare and safety.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies. The applicant is required to have 4 security guards for 1,000 persons. The applicant has hired Premier Security Services. 7 security guards have been contracted during the event 8/21-8/23. The company will also be available for the overnight camping component of the festival. (Exhibit A-6) A volunteer crew, DSM Volunteer Crew, of 20-40 will also be available to assist in security throughout the event. This is above the code standard and approved by the County Sheriff.

**There will be 8 gates covered by volunteers to include: 1. River and Croy Streets 2. Croy Creek Road and Lion's Park Entrance 3. Main Entrance Gate (ticketing) 4. Pavilion Gate**



**5. Vendor gate 6. Back stage gate 7. Gates from backstage to venue and 8. Emergency exits and surrounding festival premises. Fencing will be erected to assist in mitigating security risks. (See Exhibit A-4.)**

*7. Fire Protection: Fire protection, including alarms, extinguishing devices, fire lanes and escapes sufficient to meet all Federal, State and local standards for the location of the assembly and sufficient emergency personnel to efficiently operate the required equipment. The plan for fire protection and emergency personnel shall be presented to the Rural Fire Chief for approval at least sixty (60) days prior to the proposed assembly.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies upon conditions. The applicant proposes to host two (2) Fire department personnel at the event. Eight (8) fire extinguishers will be available on site. In addition, a minimum 20' fire lane to be reserved in case of an emergency. A fire tent will be available next to the medical tent. Emergency exits will be located at five (5) gates and an additional exit is located through the Draper Preserve Trail to the back side of Hailey. No fires are permitted for overnight camping and no smoking at the event.

**Suggested Conditions:** Mike Baledge of Wood River Fire and Rescue (WRFR) and the City of Hailey have provided comments. (Exhibit B-4) These five comments should all be added as conditions.

*8. Fencing: If the area to be used for the assembly is outdoors, the area may be enclosed by a fence of a type approved by the Board of Commissioners, which shall provide sufficient entrances and exits for those attending the assembly as well as sufficient entrances and exits for the exclusive use of emergency vehicles. Additional fencing may be required by the Board of Commissioners if necessary to protect public health, welfare and safety.*

**>Staff Comment:** Complies with Conditions: Fencing is proposed around event and to limit access to the river.

**Suggested Condition:** If fencing material cannot be cut through easily, then access gates shall be provided in case emergency personnel need to access the river or the preserve area beyond the fencing.

**Suggested Condition:** The applicant shall submit a fencing plan to protect wetlands on the Wood River Land Trust (WRLT) Property. Specifically the wetland area from the venue to the upper bench City of Hailey snow storage property where camping will take place. The applicant is requesting a path so pedestrians will not be on Croy Road for safety reasons. WRLT requested the applicant meet them on site during dry conditions to create a plan that is mutually agreeable. The applicant shall submit a fencing plan agreed on by the land owner (WRLT) for access to camping from the event venue 30 days prior to event. All fencing must be able to be cut through easily.

*9. Traffic Control: All traffic control shall be approved by the Sheriff of Blaine County and the appropriate highway district at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed assembly and emergency entrances and exits shall be kept open at all times for the use of emergency*

vehicles. The applicant is responsible for providing traffic-control persons who shall be approved by the Sheriff of Blaine County at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed assembly.

**>Staff Comment: Complies. The County Sheriff reviewed the Traffic control plan and had no comments.** (Traffic Control Plans A-8, A-9 & A-10)

*10. Lawful Compliance: Any actions undertaken pursuant to this Chapter as part of the proposed assembly shall comply with all other applicable County ordinances and adopted codes.*

**>Staff Comment: Complies. See below:**

**§9-7 Residential/Agricultural District (R-5): Does not apply.**

**§9-17-6 Riparian Setback District: Complies. The proposed event area is within the required seventy five foot (75') setback of the Big Wood River although none of the activities violate district regulations.**

*B. Insurance And Bond:*

*1. An insurance policy, underwritten by an insurance company licensed to do business in Idaho in the minimum amount of two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00), which shall indemnify and hold harmless Blaine County or any of its agents, officers, servants and employees from any liability or causes of action which might arise by reason of granting this license, and from any cost incurred in cleaning up any waste material produced or left by the assembly at the site or surrounding areas, shall be filed with the Blaine County Clerk and Recorder at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed assembly. The Board of Commissioners, in its discretion, may require additional insurance to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare.*

**>Staff Comment: Complies upon condition. The County has received the "Certificate of Liability" (Exhibit A-16) from the applicant's insurance company. The Certificate shows \$2,000,000 coverage. Blaine County is listed as additionally insured.**

*2. A performance bond, in the minimum amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), shall be deposited with the Board of Commissioners at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed assembly to ensure compliance with all terms of this Chapter. In addition, a cash bond in the minimum amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) may be required to be deposited with the Board of Commissioners to pay for damage to adjoining or nonadjoining properties within one thousand feet (1,000') of the site of the proposed assembly or lands used in conjunction with the proposed assembly. The Board of Commissioners, in its discretion, may require additional amounts or additional performance bonds to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare.*

**>Staff Comment: According to Wood River Insurance (A-16), the Bond of \$10,000 shall be renewed 60 days prior to the expiration date of last year's policy.**

**Suggested condition: The applicant shall submit the renewed \$10,000 Bond to Blaine County Land Use Department 30 days prior to event.**

*Additional Requirements: The Board of Commissioners reserves the right to increase the minimum requirements set forth herein upon finding that the potential risks posed by a proposed public assembly require additional measures to adequately safeguard the public health, safety and welfare. The Board of Commissioners may approve a permit for a public assembly that exceeds the requirements of this Chapter upon finding that the applicant has taken additional steps to mitigate the potential risks posed by the assembly to the public health, safety, and welfare including, but not limited to, additional emergency and medical services, traffic control, insurance, and bonding. The Board of Commissioners may waive any or all of the requirements set forth in this Chapter upon finding that a proposed assembly, or a portion thereof, poses little or no risk to the public health, safety, and welfare.*

**2-2-7: REMOVAL OF SITE ALTERATIONS AND RESTORATION:**

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At the termination of the assembly, the licensee shall remove all site alterations from the assembly site and shall, to the extent it is reasonably practicable, restore the assembly site to its original condition. In the event this is not accomplished within ten (10) days after the assembly, the Board of Commissioners is authorized to accomplish the removal and restoration and charge the costs against the performance bond.

**>Staff Comment: Tear down date August 23<sup>th</sup> 8am -5 pm with 50 staff and volunteer assistance.**

### III. DECISION OPTIONS AND POSSIBLE CONDITIONS:

► **Suggested Motion:** I move to approve or deny this application by DrSwanMusic, LLC for a public assembly license for The Draper Rendezvous, finding the proposed application complies with the provisions of Title 2, Chapter 2, Public Assemblies, subject to the following conditions:

**The following items are not compliant with Blaine County Code and require waivers from the Board for approval:**

1. §2-2-3(F): states that no event shall be held within ¼ mile of the mean high water mark of any public water body.
2. §2-2-5(A)1d: requires 1 physician and 1 nurse and/or EMT. **2 EMT's are proposed.**

**Possible conditions of approval:**

1. Copies of all food vendor permits shall be submitted to South Central District Health at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
2. Two (2) EMT'S shall be secured 30 days prior to the event. The names of EMT's shall be submitted to Blaine County Land Use Department.
3. Encroachment Permit shall be secured 30 days prior to event for any encroachment in the County Right of Way.
4. No parking is permitted along Croy Creek Road due to increased fire potential in August.
5. If fencing material cannot be cut through easily, then access gates shall be provided in case of an emergency personnel need to access the river or the preserve area beyond the fencing.
6. An unobstructed 20' wide fire lane shall be provided to the parking area and the Draper Preserve parking area at the pavilion. Fences, gates, parked cars, and tents shall not encroach on the access for emergency vehicles.
7. The applicant shall submit the renewed \$10,000 Bond to Blaine County Land Use Department 30 days prior to event.
8. The applicant shall submit a fencing plan to protect wetlands on the Wood River Land Trust (WRLT) Property. Specifically, the wetland area from the venue to the upper bench City of Hailey snow storage property where camping will take place. The applicant is requesting a path so pedestrians will not be on Croy Creek Road for safety reasons. WRLT requested the applicant meet them on site during dry conditions to create a plan that is mutually agreeable. The applicant shall submit a fencing plan agreed on by the land owner (WRLT) for access to camping from the event venue 30 days prior to event. All fencing must be able to be cut through easily.
9. Two (2) fire personnel must be secured 30 days prior to the event. Applicant shall submit names to Blaine County Land Use Department.
10. Landowner permission letters for camping shall be secured 90 days prior to the event: May 22, 2020.
11. This public assembly license shall permit the assembly of 1,000 maximum of persons.

12. Campfires shall be prohibited and open flame cooking devices will be limited to LPG (propane) appliances only.
13. Emergency Access & Egress: All emergency access and egress points, trails and roads shall be kept open and clear at all times.
14. Open flame of any type shall be prohibited outside of the park field and have a minimum clearance of 10 feet to any combustible materials. Fuel sources for open flame cooking must be properly installed in a food truck/trailer or have a 5 foot clearance from any tent or membrane structure.
15. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to keep diligent watch for fire or obstructions to access or existing and other hazards during the time the event is open to the public. The permit holder shall be expected to mitigate hazards, assist with evacuation and notify the proper authorities immediately if needed.
